



Planned Summer Camps 2009

China

Xuzhou

Located in the eastern province of Jiangsu, this camp is expected to run for 6-7 weeks from 1st July 2009. The camp is a residential camp usually running in Xuzhou Normal Teacher's School and Hai'an School. Students range in age and ability from 11-15 (some older) and from beginner to higher intermediate. £350 Flight subsidy.

Hong Kong SAR

HKSTC

The HKSTC camps now in their 10th year are well established boarding camps in HK and Guangdong. The students typically drawn from Macau and Hong Kong are range in ability from proficient to beginner. There will be two summer camps one in HKIEd in Hong Kong's new territories with students drawn from the Tongwah Group Hospital Schools. The second camp at the Utahloy school in Guangdong province draws all comers from both SARs. There is an additional program in Hong Kong planned but not confirmed. Expected dates are from 24th June - 9th August. The second program may extend the dates to 1st September. £500 flight subsidy.

South Korea

The two Korea camps will recruit 30 teachers between them. The students are drawn from schools in and around Seoul. The camps are expected to be day camps starting mid-July and finishing in early/mid-September. £500 flight subsidy.

Vietnam

Hanoi - YCEP

The Hanoi camp is run in partnership with a British Council established youth group, the YGCP. The students for the camp are drawn from schools across Hanoi and we endeavour to include a charitable dimension to the camps, working either in orphanages or on other volunteer placements the YGCP are involved with. The camp is expected to run for 4 weeks from 24th July. £350 flight funding available.



Other camps

Qinghai

Located in the far west of China, this camp operates in a Tibetan minority area. Usually lasting 4 weeks from July 4th, the camp is well suited to those enjoying a touch physical and mental challenge. Conditions are very basic and the students enthusiastic beginners. The running of the camp is subject to local political conditions and sourcing appropriate sponsorship. Due to difficulties sourcing sponsorship this year it is unlikely that we will be able to run this camp. £300 flight subsidy.
